

St James Student Code of Conduct June 2018

Rationale

The St James community believes that this school should be a happy and safe learning environment which meets the needs of students at all levels of their primary school life. The Code of Conduct is consistent with Department of Education guidelines and regulations. Our policy is based on rights, rules, and responsibilities of all students attending St James.

Purpose

A positive school climate exists when all members of the school community feel safe, comfortable, and accepted. Active and engaged students are aware of their rights, but more importantly, they accept responsibility for protecting their rights and the rights of others.

This Code of Conduct has a specific focus on safeguarding children and young people at St James School against sexual, physical, psychological and emotional abuse or neglect. It is intended to complement child protection legislation, school policies/procedures and professional standards, codes or ethics as these apply to staff and personnel.

All staff, volunteers, contractors, clergy and board/school council members at St James School are expected to actively contribute to a school culture that respects the dignity of its members and affirms the Gospel values of love, care for others, compassion and justice. They are required to observe child-safe principles and expectations for appropriate behaviour towards and in the company of children, as noted below.
